


SNAPs – HOPWA TA Announcement: Housing & Health (H²) Initiative



What: Improving participant access and utilization of mainstream healthcare services at the systems level through TA efforts including:

- Homeless & Healthcare Systems Integration Action Planning Sessions
- Webinars
- Listserv Messages and ACA Website Enhancements
- Health Insurance Data Collection & Quality Improvement

Why: To maximize care coverage and ensure effective coordination of supportive services and housing.

When: December 2014 - September 2015



On October 17, 2014, the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) [announced](#) the availability of Homeless and Healthcare Systems Integration Action Planning Technical Assistance (TA). Communities are invited to request this TA using the following instructions.

How to Apply for Direct Onsite TA:

This TA is available to grantees, sub-recipients and/or project sponsors of the following programs: Continuum of Care (CoC), Emergency Solutions Grants (ESG) & Housing Opportunities for Persons with AIDS (HOPWA). Communities, represented by the lead CoC Collaborative Entity are encouraged to submit an onsite TA request as soon as possible.

The first selection round will be held in early December. Please email the following information to actionplanning@homebaseccc.org with the subject line "Action Planning Session TA Request:

1. Name and contact information for the point of contact on the TA request;
2. The grant number(s) of the CoC(s) you are representing;
3. Written affirmation (e.g., PDF copies of emails or signed letters) of support from your CoC Coordinator(s), and your role in the CoC;
4. Key concern(s) you would like this TA to help resolve; and
5. Brief description of the stakeholder organization(s) and individual(s) you would like to see at your Planning Session, and what kind of outcome(s) you would like to achieve.
