




Demonstration of Need for PSH in Cedar Rapids

Linn County Point-in-Time Counts




Living on the Street Point in Time Trends January 2011- July 2015





NOTE: Men and women make up the vast majority of homeless individuals counted on the streets during the point-in-time count. Children are less likely to be seen living on the street and therefore not included in this report.

PSH in Cedar Rapids: CR has only 8 PSH beds available. They are all in the same unit and serve chronically homeless men. Other PSH is referenced but the units did not meet HUDs PSH definition, and the agency that ran them no longer exists (CCIA).

Veteran Specific Data:



According to Don Tyne from Linn County Veteran Affairs:

“In 2015 4,250 Linn County Veterans received relief help do to being low income, which included \$135,370.10 in direct rent and utility payments. 3,226 vets utilized the Veterans Affairs food pantry. Those programs prevented many of these veterans from going homeless. We saw 98 homeless veterans in Linn County from Jan to Dec 2015.”
